

Modern Messianic Jewish Prayer Liturgy

Opening Blessing (Adaptation of Traditional Kavanah)

Hineni, here I am before You, Adonai Eloheinu v'Elohei Avoteinu v'Imoteinu, Lord our God and God of our ancestors. God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob; God of Sarah, Rebecca, Rachel, and Leah; God of Yeshua our Messiah. I stand before You with reverence and humility, opening my heart to Your divine presence.

Gratitude for Miracles (Based on Modeh Ani)

Modeh/Modah ani lefanecha, Melech chai v'kayam, she'asita imi nissim u'niflaot b'chol yom.

I give thanks before You, Living and Eternal King, who has performed miracles and wonders for me each day.

Master of all Creation, You who split the sea and led Your people to freedom, You who raised Yeshua from the grave and conquered death itself—I thank You for the miracles You continue to perform in my life. For the breath in my lungs, for the provision You bring, for the healing You provide, for the protection You grant—these are all testimonies to Your mighty hand.

Open my eyes to recognize the daily miracles that surround me. Help me to witness Your divine intervention in both the mundane and the extraordinary moments of life. As it is written, "I will tell of all Your wonders" (Psalm 9:1).

Prayer for Justice (Inspired by Psalms)

Righteous Judge of all the earth, You see the wickedness that plagues our world. You witness the evil that corrupts the nations and the injustices that cause Your children to suffer.

Adonai, kumah! Arise, O Lord! Let not the wicked triumph. Let not evil prevail in the land of the living. Remember Your promise that You will not leave the guilty unpunished, nor will You forsake those who seek Your face.

In the name of Yeshua our Messiah, who taught us to pray for Your Kingdom to come and Your will to be done on earth as it is in heaven, I ask that You would bring swift justice to those who oppress the vulnerable. Expose the hidden works of darkness and bring to light the deeds done in secret.

As it is written: "For the Lord loves justice and does not forsake His faithful ones. Wrongdoers will be completely destroyed; the offspring of the wicked will perish." (Psalm 37:28)

Prayer for Tikkun Olam (Repairing the World)

Sovereign Creator, You formed this world in perfection, yet it has been broken by sin and the yetzer hara (evil inclination). Through the sacrifice of Yeshua, You have begun the great work of restoration, yet much remains to be healed.

I join my heart with Yours in the sacred work of tikkun olam—repairing and healing Your world. Use me as Your vessel to bring light where there is darkness, hope where there is despair, and love where there is hatred.

B'shem Yeshua HaMashiach, in the name of Yeshua the Messiah, I pray for:

- An end to war and violence among nations
- Liberation for those trapped in poverty and oppression
- Healing for the sick and comfort for the grieving
- Protection for the vulnerable and justice for the exploited
- Reconciliation between divided peoples and communities

May Your Ruach HaKodesh (Holy Spirit) move across the face of the earth once more, bringing renewal and restoration to all creation.

Prayer for the Coming of Messiah's Kingdom

Avinu Malkeinu, our Father, our King, we long for the day when Yeshua HaMashiach will return to establish Your perfect kingdom. We await the day when, as the prophet Isaiah foretold, "The wolf will live with the lamb... They will neither harm nor destroy on all my holy mountain, for the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the LORD as the waters cover the sea." (Isaiah 11:6,9)

Hasten the day when every knee shall bow and every tongue confess that Yeshua HaMashiach is Lord. Bring swiftly the time when there will be no more tears, no more pain, no more suffering, and no more death.

Until that day, strengthen me to be Your faithful witness. Grant me courage to speak truth to power, to defend the oppressed, to comfort the broken-hearted, and to proclaim the good news of Your salvation through Yeshua.

Closing Prayer (Adaptation of Aleinu)

It is upon us to praise the Master of all, to ascribe greatness to the Creator of everything. For You have made us different from the nations of the world and have chosen us through Your Son Yeshua to proclaim Your truth.

Therefore, we bow in reverence and thanksgiving before You, O King of kings, the Holy One, blessed be He.

V'ne'emar: V'hayah Adonai l'Melech al kol ha'aretz, bayom hahu, bayom hahu, yih'yeh Adonai echad, u'shmo echad.

And it is said: "The LORD will be king over all the earth. On that day the LORD will be one and His name one." (Zechariah 14:9)
